WHY ARE AUSTRALIAN SWANS BLACK?

Australian swans are black, while most swans are white. Why should this be?

When I was a child, growing up in Australia, the only swans I saw were black. At Lake Wendouree in Ballarat, or in the Botanic Gardens of Melbourne, the swans were slightly menacing in their quest for bits of bread, held out by my little-girl hand. All snakey black necks, gleaming red eyes and candy-red beaks, eager to peck and grab. I didn't see my first real white swan until much later. Of course, all of the heroic swans in stories (e.g. The Ugly Duckling, Swan Lake) were white. Back then, most of our stories were still from the old country (Britain), and we were just emerging from the 'white Australia policy'. Sadly, I don't think we've fully escaped the latter, even today... but I digress.


Globally, there are 'seven swans a-swimming': five species are white, one is white-with-a-black-neck, and one is black.

Before I go on, it's important to remember that there doesn't *need* to be an adaptive reason for everything in the living world. For example, armpits exist because of arms, not because having an armpit increases the chance of survival.* But it's fun to speculate on the reasons for things, so here we go...

The colour of animals is influenced by:

- the need to hide from, or deter, predators
- 2. the need to hide from prey
- 3. the need to look gorgeous to the opposite sex
- 4. other traits that may not be visible, but increase the chance of survival, and are genetically linked to colour.

Presumably, white swans can hide well in snowy or icy landscapes which are common in the northern hemisphere, and the southern end




America, but are rare in Australia. The limited ice and snow in Australia might lessen the advantage of being white, and other colours might be better for camouflage. But why black and not some other colour? The Australian landscape is hardly black. But maybe our lake waters are darker because of higher levels of tannin. Or maybe the black swan evolved in a volcanic landscape with black lava fields and black-sand beaches (black swans are also found in New Zealand). But adult swans don't have many predators. And black swans don't need to hide from prey because they are vegetarian. For these reasons, I'm not convinced that swans are black because it provides good camouflage.

In animals, the colours brown, grey and black are created by the pigment melanin. This pigment also makes feathers stronger, and it's thought that many birds have black wing-tips because high levels of melanin protect the flight feathers from wear-and-tear. But perhaps swans didn't hear about this little secret because their flight feathers are white.

Melanin also protects the skin against the damaging

effects of UV radiation. I don't know if similar




Interestingly, some aspects of bird fitness have been correlated with the presence of melanin. Darker morphs of the tawny owl (i.e. those with more melanin) were found to have a better immune response than lighter morphs. Darker morphs of the screech owl appeared to be more stressed when exposed to cold temperatures than lighter morphs, experienced greater mortality in cold, dry winters, and were better at coping with warmer conditions. Could this also explain why the black swan is found in Australia, which has mild winters, and white swans occur where it is colder?

High levels of melanin have also been linked to reproductive success. Dark morphs of the feral pigeon were found to have larger testes and reproduced more often than blue pigeons. Perhaps the first dark swans

to appear in Australian populations from chance mutation were carrying the same (hidden) advantages, and went on to dominate the gene pool until all Australian swans were black?

They were all strangely attracted to the dark male pigeon, but couldn't say exactly why.

However, when animals choose a mate based on colour, this can also be influenced by the colour of their favourite foods. A bit like choosing a red-headed mate if you like to eat oranges, carrots and pumpkins. For example, female guppies prefer males with orange-spotted



tails, and researchers reckon this is because they also like eating orange fruits. Interestingly, many birds prefer red and black to other colours. This may explain why many plants with bird-dispersed seeds package them up in red or black fruits, and why more bird poop ends up on red and black cars. So maybe the Australian swan ended up black with red eyes and a red beak simply because these colours were irresistible to the opposite sex?

Well after all that, I still don't know why black swans are black. My brief, but fairly wide-ranging literature review has provided lots of ideas, but no definite answers. Even for our most familiar animals there's still much we don't know, and many theories that have never been tested.

Cockatoos are also either black (seven species) or white (11 species), with a few pink and grey ones (3 species) thrown in. Maybe they have some clues? But that's another story, for another day.



ARAUCANA NOT ONLY CHICKEN LAYING BLUE EGGS

The **Cream Legbar** (or Crested Cream Legbar) is a very popular autosexing Legbar, thanks to them also laying blue coloured eggs, a

trait genetically, these birds obtained from the Araucana
This trait came about in the UK in 1939
when a Michael Pease was working with
some Gold Legbars he had been trying
to improve by crossing into a utility White
Leghorn cock obtained from Cheshire College
of Agriculture. He kept two pullets from this mating
that were 'off white' in colour and put these back to
a Gold Legbar cock from the same strain he had started with.

118 chicks were hatched over a two-year period, and 49 of these looked much the same as the Gold Legbar, the remaining birds being white in colour. He crossed these (i.e. brother to sister) to reveal any recessive genes (from the White Leghorn, since the dominant white gene carries many other plumage colour genes hidden) and had some unexpected cream coloured offspring that still retained autosexing qualities.

These birds were crossed with the then (rather new) Cream Araucanas in 1940 that a Professor Punnett had in Cambridge to experiment with Cream coloured birds. These had crests and laid blue eggs, and from this cross, the Crested Cream Legbar was established. It is said the crest was kept to prevent confusion with the Silver Legbar.

The Cream Legbar is very different in makeup from the Gold or Silver Legbar, so many people consider it a separate breed, however, at this time, the Poultry Club of Great Britain for example, still classifies it as a variety of Legbar along with the Gold and Silver Legbars



BIRDS NOT BREEDING—MY THEORY by Len March

For the last 10 years I have been wondering why my some of my birds do not breed. I have spoken to quite a few friends about it and they appear to have the same problem – WHY as it is natural for a bird to reproduce.

After the show season I put all my birds into a large flight so they get plenty of exercise. In December I start to condition them in the same way that I have done for the last 30 years so by the time they are ready to go into their breeding cages in early March they look fit and well with no sign of illness.

When the hens are making their nest I let the cock bird in and wait for the first egg to be laid a week or two later. Some hens have not laid an egg but still sit in the nest then another hen may not make a nest and does not seem interested in the cock bird even though he looks nice and fit and is singing. Is it because the hen is not in condition?

Most times when a hen is in tip top condition and she hears a cock bird singing she will mate with almost any cock bird that you feel is ready but sometimes the hen will have nothing to do with any cock bird.

Now this could a few things:

1/ she can see and hear the cock singing but does not like his song or

2/ does she know that the cock is unwell and will not fill eggs

I say this because I had that sort of trouble where the cock was jumping around and singing

but the hen attack him and would have nothing to do with him than three weeks later the cock died the hen laid clear eggs.

Sometimes a hen will throw out a chick from the nest and no matter how many times you put it back she will throw it out I think the hen knows that the chick is unwell.

At the end of the breeding season some hens have done nothing they have not built a nest even though they are only one or two years old, I have had hens that in their first year will lay and bring up chicks then in the second year they do not seem interested this is the time you ask

Yourself question why, this is always the time you need to watch that bird.

One year I had an hen bring up four chicks in her first round then after about four weeks all the chicks all died, the hen did not have a second

round, the next year she did not breed then just before the moult she died so my theory is she must have been ill for over a year.

I have found that a bird that is unwell may not show you any signs at the beginning of the breeding season, but once it starts to moult it goes light and dies. This has happened to me with three hens and two cocks. What I think, is the bird has been unwell since the start of the breeding season even though it showed no signs and I feel that this is the reason it did not breed.

So my question is do we keep birds that are unwell can they live for well over a year but look fit and well.

I have also found that if you can keep a bird alive after it has been ill the next year it will not breed so why spend a lot of money trying to save them.

I have also found that a cock bird could be ill for a long time and that could be another reason for clear eggs.

Two years ago I had a very nice white black opal cock it came back from a show and did not look well I spent money trying to save it which I did but the next breeding it did not breed and then died.

I have now been keeping and breeding birds for well over 30 years and like most of us I have had lots of ups and downs I still do not have all the answers and maybe I never will. A friend said to me the other day well that's bird breeding......

Well these are just my thoughts. You may have a different theory why birds do not breed maybe you could let me know.

IS A "PINK" BUDGERIGAR POSSIBLE?

Many years ago in the U.K., in the 1950s I think, there was hot debate on the possibility of breeding a pink budgerigar. It even got to the stage of one of the major seed companies offering a prize of 1,000 UK Pounds to the first person to do so. I doubt if the prize was ever claimed since there don't seem to have been any records kept to that effect and I'm not aware of anyone who even claims to have seen such a dazzling bird. But let's face it, the British breeders aren't idiots and they'd hardly be taken in by such a debate if it was as foolish as it initially sounds, so maybe we could look at what creating such a possibility might entail, rather than just waiting for another mutation to drop in on us.

For a great many years canaries were restricted in colour to just Yellow, Buff, Cinnamon and Green. Then it was found that canaries would breed with Redhooded Siskins and that certain hybrid cocks from such matings were fertile. Through these birds the red colour of the Siskin was introduced into canaries. Could such a red factor be introduced into budgerigars through crossing it with other small members of the parrot family who carry that colour naturally?



If so, what options are there for experimental breeders? Perhaps the most promising such bird is the Splendid Grass Parrakeet (Neophema splendida). They are similar in size to present day budgerigars and perhaps a start would be to raise some of their babies in the same nest as young budgerigars. Reared this way they would establish a close affinity with budgerigars, making hybridising that much easier. Splendid Parrakeet cocks appear to be rather amorous and I don't think much difficulty would be experienced in crossing them with hen budgerigars. Then the wait for fertile eggs but an even more excruciating wait to find out if any cocks from such a mating were to be fertile! The general consensus at the time of the UK discussion however appeared to be that if or when

there was to be a colour break in the pink direction (using pure budgerigars), it would be most likely to occur among birds which have the Violet character in their genetic makeup, but on what back- ground must it be blended to further the desired result?

Many arguments centered on the likely possibilities from using Violet Albinos, a variety nonnally discarded as being of little consequence. Others insisted that of the Violet forms, those which also have the Cinnamon character would be the most useful for heading towards the Pink because of the absence of the black pigment in their feathering. In the 1952 -3 edition of Cyril Rodger's book 'Budgerigars and How to Breed Them' he mentioned the breeding of Albino Violets: "Periodically Albinos are bred which show an excess of suffusion and such birds, irrespective of quality, are discarded from the Albino strain. These birds however can be put to very good use in the production of the delightful Albino Violets. "If the most heavily suffused Albinos are used in the breeding of Albino Violets it will result in Albinos with a decided pink or rose tinting being bred. A few years of careful selective breeding could give the breeder a stock of really beautifully coloured birds. The few specimens I have bred and seen did not come about by selection but even then they were striking in their unusual shade of colour".

Although such Albino Violets do show a rosy-pink suffusion in varying depths they cannot be called Pink Budgerigars as the colour is mainly confined to the flank and rump areas. They are extremely attractive when seen flying in an aviary and do reveal the possibility of a Pink or Red mutation occurring. Albino Violets are quite easy to produce by pairing heavily suffused Albino Skyblue cocks to Violet Cobalt (Visual Violet) bens. All the young hens will be Albinos, with a proportion being Albino Violets. These birds can be identified by the colour of their suffusion when in adult feather. If in turn they are paired to further heavily suffused Albino cocks there will be a proportion of Albino Violet cocks and hens. When making these pairings the Albinos used should always be 'bad' coloured specimens and the Violet Cobalts those which have the reddish - violet tone as opposed to the bluish- violet shades.

HOW TO BREED CAGE BIRDS FOR COLOUR

Breeding birds is a popular pasttime for enjoyment, new discoveries, challenges, friendships and even an income. Large amounts of money is spent on acquiring breeding stock and caring for the birds in the aviaries. Literally thousands of books, guides and manuals have been written on the subject.

Amazingly the human eye can not detect the magenta colour of light waves, as it is not a colour on the visual colour spectrum. A magenta coloured bird in the aviary will appear white to the human eye! But if the breeder wants to breed with it, he must know its true hidden colour, referred to as the virtual colour of the bird

This "magenta trap" explains why a white bird crossed with a yellow bird reproduces red birds. It is because the white in some birds is actually magenta, and magenta and yellow produces the red offspring!

In studying bird colours for more than 40 years, amongst others as a bird breeder, the author has made a number of remarkable new discoveries related to the creation and changes in bird colours. What he has discovered explains all the different bird colours appearing in aviaries and as seen by bird watchers in nature, and also point scientists in a direction to revise and perfect the "Science of Avichroma", the name that he has given to the science of studying bird colours.

The book contains four sections, discussing the formation of colours in birds, describing the 9 colour defects, of which 4 causes most colour changes, describing step by step how bird breeders should plan, track and breed their birds for colours, and a section with general information.

With the knowledge contained in this book, bird breeders will now for the first time, by breeding with virtual birds and keeping proper records, be able to fully understand the differently coloured birds of the same species that they may breed.

HOW SPARROWS ARRIVED IN AUSTRALIA

In Australia, like so many other countries, the house sparrow is one of the five most commonly seen birds in backyards and gardens. This is a result of intentional introductions over the past two centuries.

The story of how house sparrows came to Australia has several new twists. Recent research shows just how much effort was made to introduce the species as an early form of bio-control (almost a century before the cane toad was introduced to help control the cane beetle).

Most surprisingly, historical documents reveal that the first house sparrows to arrive and breed in Australia actually arrived from India, not England as has been believed for more than 100 years.

Alongside them came the most vilified introduced bird in Australia, the common myna.

Over the past two centuries Australia has become a new home for hundreds of introduced species of plants and animals. Many of these have become serious pests, causing major losses to agricultural production and threatening Australia's endemic biodiversity.

The house sparrow and myna dominate many urban areas in Australia but, on account of their dependence on people, have mostly stayed in human-modified environments. They have apparently caused little damage to native species.

While species have been introduced to Australia for a variety of reasons, many people assume that these birds were introduced for very frivolous ones. Common belief is that English songbirds were introduced by homesick colonists so they could once again hear the familiar sounds of home, in a land where the birds were unfamiliar. But our research reveals a different story.

The first sparrows arrived in Australia in late 1862. They were shipped after a prolonged campaign led by Edward Wilson, editor of the Melbourne Argus.

Wilson had established the Victorian Acclimatisation Society, set up with the support of the Victorian government to import useful species. Sparrows, it was thought, could help the struggling agricultural sector.

A series of articles and editorials in 1860-61 drew attention to famines in Hungary and France that were reportedly caused by the destruction of so many songbirds in the farming districts of those countries.

Studies in Switzerland showed that while sparrows do cause some damage to fruit crops, this is outweighed by the number of insect pests that the birds feed to their nestlings (3,000 per nest).

In 1860 Wilson called for farmers to "wage war" on insects pests with sparrows and starlings. He also confessed that:

I like to see a bird in the streets, and I have a kindly feeling for the sparrow for his friendly confidence in this way.

This attitude may explain accusations of frivolity, but the sparrow was valued above other birds because they associated more strongly with people than other birds, and their worth had been demonstrated in Europe and New York where they had been introduced to attack insects defoliating city trees.

By today's standards, however, efforts to ascertain the ecological and agricultural risks were very poor. The same people are also to blame for the introduction of the rabbit, fox and carp – to mention just three major pests.

So, in the early 1860s, Wilson and the Acclimatisation Society went to great efforts to transport birds from Europe. Birds were kept alive during the long voyage by sea and then acclimated to Australian conditions by being held in large aviaries in Melbourne (on the site that later became the Melbourne Zoo), before their release around the colony. This was a challenging enterprise and the value of a live sparrow arriving in Melbourne encouraged greater care on board the ships.


An inadvertent consequence of the economic value placed on the arrival of a sparrow in Australia was that it created a new market for opportunism. The sea passage from India was significantly shorter than that from Europe and an enterprising shipping agent in India, G. J. Landells, took full advantage of this.

New research has uncovered clear documentary evidence that house sparrows arrived from India in 1862 and were breeding successfully in Melbourne before any arrived alive from England (in early 1863). This means it is highly likely that the house sparrows in Australia today are a genetic mix of Indian and European sparrows. The house sparrows in India were native to the subcontinent and are a different race of house sparrow from the one in Europe.

The newspapers of the time also make it clear that, along with each shipment of sparrows from India, a number of common mynas also arrived. This is presumably because they were abundant in the same places as the sparrows and it was argued that they would be a useful addition for eating insects in towns and farms.

In 1863, Landells placed an advertisement in The Sydney Morning Herald offering to export more "minas" to Melbourne for 20 shillings each, and house sparrows at ten shillings each.

While it's unlikely that he became rich on the back of such a market, his enterprise changed the avian landscape of Australia's backyards forever.




